Poland

I am a Mathematician (American Citizen by birth) living 6 years in an a Polish personent residence permit (Karta Pobytu Stalege), with a Polish wife, and a home which I bought with money I had invites carned in the USA.

last October 5, 1932, at least 15 agents of the SB searched my house in Nadeliee Wik., 15 KM south of Wroclaw. In the course of this search they illegally planted printing material and falsely accused me of printing illegal underground material. They are suspicious of me because one of my long-time acquaintances, who is coauthor with me of a mathematical paper published in France, is presently underground and is important in this movement.

Teday, at 1:00FM. I went to the bureau of passports here in Ercolaw to arrange a return visa which would allow me to attend an International Mathemacal Conference arranged by the Czechoslovak Academy of Sciences, to which I have been invited, my expenses to be paid for by the organizing counities in Praga. The passport official asked for me to wait, and in 4 few minutes returned with one of the SB agents who had searched my home in October. They demanded that I stand up, at which time they read to me a purported decision (a document consisting of 2 pages and 4-6 identical copies) demanding that I leave the country by December 31 of this year. Furthernore, they demanded that I arrange my affairs in Madolice, where my home is, and report to the local police everyday at noon. They told me that one copy was for me, and demanded that I sign the documents. I teld them that I did not wish to sign the documents until I had suidied it and with the help of a lawyer. Then they continued to press me, I agreed to sign the document, but only under the condition that I would be able to write under my signature that my signature only meant that I had received the document, and not that I was legally bound by its contents. They then took amy my copy of the document, saying that it was only important that I know its contexts, and that they needed all copies. They said that I could only appeal the decision through their it intermidiary with the Polish Minestry of Interior. in Varues. They then took my Karta Pobytu Stalogo (Permanent Residence Visa) and my American Passport, and told me to wait for them in the waiting room, and that they would take an home to Hadolice. I walked out of the room, and out of the building into the street, and now am in hiding with friends, without my personal documents (Passport & Visa).

Can you help me?? What recourse do I have? They have not returned many of my things, including important scientific correspondences, as well as other personal notes and writings and things that I had in my possession. Since I have a wife, house, my scientific work and contacts, I do not wish to leave Poland at this time, and certainly cannot arrange all matters in one week's time, since I am afraid even to return to my house.

In October, after they searched my home, I met the American Cultural Attachee Officer from Warssw, a Mrs. Syvia 7, and I told her about my problems. My American Passport was issued at your Warssw Embasey in May of this year, if I am not mistaken. She wrote down the number of my passport, and I am sure that you have recoord of me in Warssw. Also I have met a number of your consuls at the Embassey.

I believe that I should at least have the right to simply a meeting with the Pelish Minestry of Interior, without the intermediary of the SB have in Wronlaw. I am quite certain that they do not know of the illegal and wrong doings of the SB in their treatment of me.

Fould you please interested directly to the Polish Minestry of Interior. and make an appeal for them to hear my case. Please advise me what to do. I swait your reply in great anxiety for my personal safety. I am sorry that I have no other choice other than to write to you and

trouble you with this serious matter.

In the event that my attempts at righting this unfounded and injust decision fail, and if I am mable to find the occasion to personally come to the Institute and say good-bye, I want to take this opportunity of expressing my pleasure of having had the opportunity to work with you and my colleagues and friends, and students at your Institute. My only regret is that I apparently will be unable to work with you all longer, but I assure you that I will always remarker all of you, and keep in touch through the mail in the future. Sometay I hope to be able to return to Poland.

I close this letter with hopes for a better future and a brighter NEW YEAR in these uncertain and troubled times. Please share this letter with all my colleagues and friends, and be sure not to forget my dear students.

Dear Sir:

I am a Mathematician (Amèrican Citizen by birth) living 6 years in Poland on a Polish permanent residence permit (Marta Pobytu Stalego), with a Polish wife, and a home which I bought with money I had earned in the USA. During the years 1977-1979, I had a scholarship at the Institute for Theoretical Physics of the University of Wroclaw as part of an Exchange Program with the University of New York at Stony Brook, and since that time until the present I have maintained my close connections with the Institute; I share an office with other members of the Institute, participate in and give seminars on my field of interest, write joint works with other members of the Institute, and direct the work of a Doctoral student. I also have the position of Benior Lecturer of Technical English (Starszy Myhladowca) at the Polytechnical Institute of Wroclaw, and, in addition, I have been teaching English as a foriegn language several hours a week at the Department of English of the University of Wroclaw, over the last two years.

On Wednesday, December 22, 1982, I was informed by the SE in Wroclaw that they were expelling me from the country on the strength of a decision made by the Ministry of Interior on December 13, 1962. In this decision I was accused of illegally printing material for the underground, based on false evidence planted at my house by the 15 or more agents of the SE who searched my home on October 5, 1982. In particular, the SE claimed, that they found in my home the printing matrix for the August 24, 1982 issue of the illegal press "SATT", an underground press which I had, up until that time, never even heard of.

I am writing directly to you at the linistry of Interior because I do not know where to turn for help in clearing myself of this false and malicious charge of the Wroclaw SB against me, and to try to get your Ministry to reverse its decision to expel me based on this charge. At the same time, I have found it impossible to arrange all my personal affairs so that I would be able to leave Foland by December 31, 1982, as they demanded.

In addition to making various threats against my personal safety, the Wrodaw of have not given no back many of my personal possessions, including:

1. 30 or more rolls of film negatives (developed), black and white and color - I as an a steur photographer.

2. Copies of letters I have written to Mewsweek, The Mational Science Foundation, United States Congressmen, and a number of important scientific correspondences.

3. About 100 addresses of friends and scientific correspondences over the years.

4. 35 pages of close-spaced typewritten pages of personal notes and reflections, and other writings.

5. Important letters of scientific reccommendation.

Letters from the Editors of book publishing companies. Until the Ministry of Interior can

1. Gaurantee my personal safety from the Wroclaw SB.

2. Gaurantee the return of all my personal possessions listed above and illegally held by the Wroclaw SB,

3. reconsider the unfounded and unjust decision of December 13, 1982,

regarding my expulsion from Poland,

I feel that I have no other alternative than to await justice when the full facts of my case can be brought to light, and my innocence can be established.

I am truely very sorry that my long stay in Poland has come to this end: I have always considered Poland to be my friend, and I have tried hard to make a life for myself here. When I finished my doctorate in Mathematics in the USA, I was unable to find the possibility of continuing my scientific work either in the USA or Western Europe; I found that opportunity here in Poland, and I will always be greatful to Poland for that opportunity. The result of my scientific work in Poland has been the publishing of 8 scientific papers and articles, and the writing of two books. Whatever value my scientific work finds in the scientific community, I will be the first to acknowledge that it owes its existence to the opportunity that I found here in Poland.

I close this letter with hopes for a better future and a brighter MEW YEAR, notonly here in Poland but all over the world in these uncertain and troubled times.

I shared with you the great joy of the Pope's triumphant return to his native land. The return of the Pope was especially meaningful to me, because I had also, in coming to Peland, returned to the land of my ferefathers and rediscovered the meaning of my Polish Heritage. I was also by your side during the year of great hope when the Solidarity Trade Union came into being. And I have been here to suffer with you the tragic aftermath of the last year, a year of so many innocent victims for whom I have prayed along side of you on the 15th of every month. Dear Ambassador:

I am writing this letter to bring the embassy up to date on my present circumstances, and to explain the steps I have taken in protest of the decision of the Polish authorities to expell me from the country by December 31. 1982.

On January 3,1983, I wrote to the Polish Ministry of Interior asking them to review the decision, and requesting them to guarantee my personal safety from the Wroclaw SB, as well as to see to it that the Wroclaw SB returned the remainder of my personal possessions to me. I sent nine copies of this letter to various places including: Gen. W. Jaruzelski, PM M. Rakowski, the Polish Sejm. PRON - Wroclaw, and etc., as well as to the American Embassy. I wrote additional letters complaining about my treatment to the Rectors of both the University and Politechnical Institute of Wroclaw, as well as to various Directors of institutes to which I had been affiliated. I also wrote open letters to a number of priests at catholic churches in Wroclaw. At least one of these letters was read at a Mass on January 13 for victims of the current political situation. In short, my case is becoming widely known and sympathised in Wroclaw.

During a recent meeting between my wife and the Wroclaw SB, they told her that it was no longer a question of expelling me from Poland, but of putting me on trail. In the meantime I've been experiencing manthuran disturbing health problems: First, I developed a pain in the left side of my chest, and more recently, perhaps not independent of the first problem. I have developed a partial paralysis in my right leg.

I don't know if the Polish Ministry of Interior is reviewing their decision in my case or not, or even whether or not they received my letter, but I feel that I've made about as big a protest of their treatment of me that I am capable of mustering, and I want to get out of my present situation as soon as possible. I would like to come to the Embassy in Warsaw, talk to you about certain matters. and to arrange for my transfer over to the Polish autiorities through the good auspicies of the Embassy. I do not want to turn myself directly over to the Wroclaw SB for fear that they would beat me and carry out other threats that they have made against my person.

I will greatly appreciate any help you can give me to help get me out of my present impossible situation.
