the Federal Government by having on file slanderous documents. 6. Restriction of freedom of information by abusing the use of the "Classified" stamp on documents, making them inaccessible to the general public.

Since I was expelled from Poland with only the shirt on my back, I am destitude and unemployed, and unable to pay for legal expenses.

I am enclosing with this letter a Notebook entitled. "It Happened in Poland". This Notebook provides a detailed account of the circumstances of my expulsion, and of the involvement of the American Embassy in Warsaw.

Thank you very much for taking the time to consider my case. I would be very grateful to hear from you about how you would advise me to proceed in this serious matter.
